 - A. Review Goals from Last Year

1. Pursue the highest levels of academic performance with primary focus on math.

a. As part of tracking academic excellence, focus specifically on students who "approach" academic expectations with the goal that these students will grow to "met or exceeded" expectations.

2. We will focus on increasing the number of students who feel a connection with staff members as measured by the Connectivity Survey from PSD

- a. Adding connectivity to staff in the building.
- b. Staff will be encouraged to participate in social events such as the Read-In.
- c. MTSS-B Chairs will visit every classroom to remind students and teachers of our universal expectations in the classroom, hallways, and lunchroom.
- d. For example, 3rd grade will departmentalize science, history and geography in order to create a relationship with each student in that grade level.

3. Maximize and measure our school- parent partnership participation

- a. Monitor this with Sign-Up.com analysis: how many volunteer positions were not filled? Examine this at the end of each trimester.
- b. improved communication create a new school video and marketing plan.
- c. Increased participation of school spirit through events, fundraisers and volunteer opportunities in the school and classroom such as Read-In events, and our Boosterthon Fundraiser. Our goal is to measure participation for a baseline.
- d. Continued community building through relationships created in the classrooms, parking lot, front office, committees, and new family mentorship.
- e. An emphasis on Traut's character traits as a foundation for creating a community which is known for and demonstrates integrity.
