Fundraiser Updates

As I shared last week, we are all so excited about the purchase and receipt of our new VR Goggles. Several of you have approached me to ask why these might be exciting and beneficial to our students. The short answer is that they allow us to take students on a "virtual field trip" through places we wouldn't otherwise get to visit (like the inside of a volcano, or to the surface of the moon, or to the Louvre museum.) I am working with the Professional Development department to get a training in place for our work day in February. This will give teachers the opportunity to learn all about how these tools can enhance student learning.

Also, I want to update you about the status of some of the other projects for which we have raised funds. Adding additional instructional spaces is a priority for us, and we are just waiting for help from the facilities department to move forward. Due to the scope and nature of the construction, permits and bids will be required. I had been told that we could expect this work to happen over the summer of 2020. I am still hopeful that will be the case. I have been assured that we will get the concrete by the front entrance fixed some time in June.

Please know that I will continue to be a "squeaky wheel" with the hope that our projects can get started as soon as possible.
