**New Before and After School Care** 

Registration for new PSD before- and after-school care provider opens May 1

<u>Selected as Poudre School District's new provider</u> of before- and after-school childcare, AlphaBEST opens enrollment May 1 for PSD families to sign up for services in the 2020-21 school year.

A secure online registration platform will be available at <u>alphabest.org/poudreco</u>.

AlphaBEST's before-school programs will run 6:30 a.m. until the site school's first bell Mondays through Fridays; after-school programs will operate from the time of a site school's dismissal until 6 p.m.

<u>AlphaBEST's rates</u> are about 20-25 percent lower, as compared with rates of PSD's former before- and after-school care provider. Full and partial scholarships are available. AlphaBEST also accepts Colorado Child Care Assistance Program, or CCCAP, vouchers and has no limit on the number of CCCAP slots available.
